## **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

Mr. Borkowski introduced the 2015-2016 Chamber Orchestra who played Dance of the Hours, Ponchielli, and Telemann Concerto, Soloist: Priya Krishnaswamy. The Chamber Orchestra included 8th grade students: Chloe Lee, Isabella Lewin, Elaina Lee, Rachel Quan, Priya Krishnaswamy, Alma Mackic, Daphne Karahalios, Katelyn Post, Tara Brunner, Grace Mockus, Jane Mockus, 7th grade students: Sydney Rubenstein, Vivian Jiao, Edward Deng, Sammy Long, Mary Clayton, Emma Lazarus, Cate Lazarus, 6th grade students: Owen Schuler, Alex Kirages.

Mr. Borkowski reported that the North Chicago schools continue to struggle financially. A letter had been sent to the Charter Commission regarding the work that has been done in North Chicago and encouraging them not to approve another charter school. A decision is expected on May 17. Mr. Borkowski spoke about gratitude and said he was grateful to be part of the Lake Forest community. He thanked the Everett staff and Mrs. Sopko for opening up the school for the Board meeting, the students who greeted them at the door and the Chamber Orchestra. The Board meetings were moved to the schools in order to increase community engagement. The Spirit of 67 awarded 26 grants amounting to over \$258,000. Mr. Borkowski thanked everyone who had donated and especially the Spirit of 67 Board. Mr. Borkowski thanked an extremely special group, the teachers of Lake Forest District 67, and stated that teacher and staff appreciation week is the first week in May. In the core values of the District there is a statement that reads "world class learning is driven by world class educators and therefore we must attract, develop, retain and invest in passionate and effective teaching professionals."

## **SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

Mr. Simeck reported that there are many meetings on the horizon with a lot of celebrating, concerts, graduations, etc. The Spirit of 67 is ramping up for the Home Tour on May 12. A meeting is scheduled for April 20 at West Campus to discuss the calendar, moving Lake Forest High School finals prior to winter break, and could also influence the start and end dates of the District 67 school year. The annual Youth Summit is scheduled for the evening of April 26 when the students will present on the state of their lives.

## **REPORTS**

### **Emotional Wellness Report**

Dr. Wiemer reported on the Comprehensive School Climate Inventory, developed by The National School Climate Center. The purpose is to help schools evaluate their school communities, to look at shared perceptions of stakeholders in the broad area of school climate, with a focus on assessing positive, safe, supportive learning environments. This year in February staff and students were surveyed and parents are surveyed every other year.

The Positive Impressions for 2016 include:

On 12 Dimensions, there are norms available by the survey publisher. On all 12 Dimensions, our scores exceed the norm sample. Another cause for celebration is that on 11/13 Dimensions, our median scores fall in the positive range. That equates to 85% of the Dimensions being in the highest category. There are high correlations between faculty and student ratings. Staff and students are seeing and experiencing the same strengths and challenges.

The improvements expressed by stakeholders:

- Safety Rules & Norms making sure we are establishing norms and expressing expectations and implementing any corrective actions
- Support for Learning – Supportive teaching practices such as encouragement, constructive feedback, individual attentions and assistance
- Social Support by Adults – Supportive and caring adult to student relationships, personal concern for students
- Physical Surroundings – Cleanliness, order, resource-rich environment
- Professional Relationships and Leadership for staff are well above the norm comparatives.

For 2015-2016 the District did its own comparison since the company will only run comparable data when the district has completed a minimum of 3 years. A lot of the areas remain stable, the faculty section shows an improvement in the area of school rules and norms over last year. There were 2 areas where the faculty expressed a very slight downturn, one was respect for diversity, and some teachers also expressed concerns on the sense of social emotional security. The district will work on both these areas.

There is an opportunity for Improvement in the area of Social Media and the District will need to take a closer look at this.

Emilie Currea, Emotional Wellness Coordinator, reported on Social/Emotional security. There were three goals for the Emotional Wellness committee, to create a District 67 emotional wellness database for each school, create a database that serves to document and archive the work of the coordinator, and plan and coordinate 2 Emotional Wellness/Social Emotional Learning professional development opportunities for staff. Emotional Wellness now has a newsletter called E-Pulse. The Emotional Wellness evaluation comparing the years 2010-2013 shows an overall positive uptake on culture and climate. The Emotional Wellness Committee strives for excellence. The strengths included, community partnerships including LEAD, CROYA, etc., and that District 67 values Emotional Wellness. The CSCI was taken in 2014. Opportunities for growth include the accountability factor for Social Emotional Learning and Character Education district-wide, expanding the role of the Emotional Wellness coordinator and creating a comprehensive Social Emotional Learning and Wellness program K-12.

## **DISTRICT COMMITTEES**

North Suburban Special Education District - Suzanne Sands  
Mr. Novit reported on behalf of Mrs. Sands that the NSSSED Leadership Council met on March 16, 2016 and again on April 13, 2016.

Lindsay Kiraly, the Coordinator of Professional Development and Coaching for NSSSED spoke about the importance of creating effective learning environments for not just Special Education students but for all students. At the March meeting Heather Miehl reported that the Village of Northbrook approved the usage of this new site for the transition program, and that the building inspection was completed. At the April meeting Mrs. Miehl reported that the project continues to be on budget and on time for students to begin attending at the new location on August 22, 2016.

The Policy Committee is continuing to work on the proposed changes to the Articles of Agreement with regard to district withdrawing. No substantive further discussion took place at these meetings. Ms. Danielle Carter, Administrator of the Educational and Life Skills (ELS) Program, provided an update regarding instructional practices that have been garnering impressive student outcomes through the use of data based decision making and best practices in instruction. Heather Miehl provided an update to the Leadership Council on the continued space constraints at the North Shore Academy Elementary program located on Revere Drive in Northbrook. She reported that all classrooms were at, or exceeding, their student capacity. Last year an additional classroom was opened in the space used for the computer lab, and due to an influx of referrals and shortage of additional space, an additional classroom to serve students in K – 2 will be opened in the art and music room.

The Leadership Council approved the 2016-2017 NSSED school calendar, which was developed to coordinate as closely as possible with member district calendars.

Rodney Carbajal a police officer and consultant hired by NSSED to review and update their Emergency Operational Plans and Procedures as well as train their staff with regard to those plans and procedures provided an overview of the work he had done with NSSED. Jim Fitton and Heather Miehl presented the FY17 Budget Draft III. Jim Fitton shared a proposed budget amendment in response to IDEA Carryover revenues that were not known at the time that the FY16 budget was adopted. It will be brought to the Leadership Council for approval at the next Leadership Council meeting that is scheduled for May 11, 2016.

#### Legislative Liaison – Beth Clemmensen

Mrs. Clemmensen reported that Senator Manar had introduced a new version of the School Funding Bill that provides a revamped formula ultimately shifting funds from wealthier districts to poorer ones. The Governor had earlier stated that the priority should be to fully fund to the foundation level however the Governor and the Legislators have been locked over the state's budget. Senator Manar's new plan will cost \$600,000,000 with an estimated \$400,000,000 in the first year to ensure school districts initially do not lose money, plus \$200,000,000 to the state to pay the costs for the Chicago Schools pensions. However, with no funding sources it is unclear exactly how this would be accomplished. Ultimately, the big changes in the bill would include a shift to the state aid formula reducing the role of local property taxes in favor of state funding. Senator Manar's proposal seeks to target state dollars to schools where it is felt the dollars could produce the biggest academic turnaround for students. Senator Manar believes the way Illinois funds education is the least equitable in the country and needs to be addressed. Losses to wealthier districts would be phased in over 3-4 years and that time would help with planning. Governor Rauner commented that "changing the formula would be hard, if it were easy it would have been done already, we cannot have a system where districts are pitted against each other but come up with a way to increase funding and focus on lower income districts and rural districts that do not have resources." The Governor has not dismissed the bill and, as stated, is considering it. How this plays out is still to be decided but it is clear conversations that may affect our district are taking place and the district needs to stay close to this issue to see what develops.

Spirit of 67 Foundation – Suzanne Sands

Mr. Novit reported on behalf of Mrs. Sands that the Spirit of 67 Foundation Board held their Annual Meeting on April 12, 2016. The Spirit has recently shared another film put together by LFHS student, Kai Kasprzak featuring the DPM Theater Rear Projection and Audio Systems grants funded this year.

Mr. Folker reported that the District 67 APT met on Wednesday, April 13<sup>th</sup> at West Campus. Mr. Simeck shared information on a new educational gaming app called "ClassCraft" that has been developed to promote teamwork and positive reinforcement in the classroom, especially amongst boys. Mike asked the Board for their thoughts on bringing this type of technology into District 67. One key takeaway from the discussion is that in middle school, boys tend to have their behavior "redirected" whereas girls tend to have their behavior "reinforced." The 3 most used words with boys are "Don't," "Stop," and "Quit."

Mrs. Whipple provided some key upcoming dates/activities for students who are transitioning into new situations/schools:

Staff Appreciation events are coming up in early May. Schools are focused on typical end-of-year activities: looking for volunteers, finalizing Boards for next year, planning year-end events (e.g., Field Day, picnics, room parties). School supplies for next year will be building-specific (vs. grade-specific) in an attempt to cut down on waste. The E-Pulse newsletter was recently sent out. The final issue will be e-mailed in May. A community conversation on the documentary “Being 13” screening and panel discussion with Andy Duran, Dr. Ingrid Weimer, Officer Conrad Christensen, Elizabeth Lombardo is scheduled for Tuesday, April 26<sup>th</sup> at the Cube from 7:00-8:30p.m. The “Mousetrap” was performed at all three elementary schools. The Emotional Wellness Committee provided students with mints ahead of this past week’s PARCC testing with a note that said “You are ‘mint’ to be awesome!” The meeting adjourned at 10:45 a.m. The final District 67 APT Executive Board meeting of the year will be the annual incoming-outgoing Board member luncheon on Wednesday, May 10<sup>th</sup> at Authentico.
